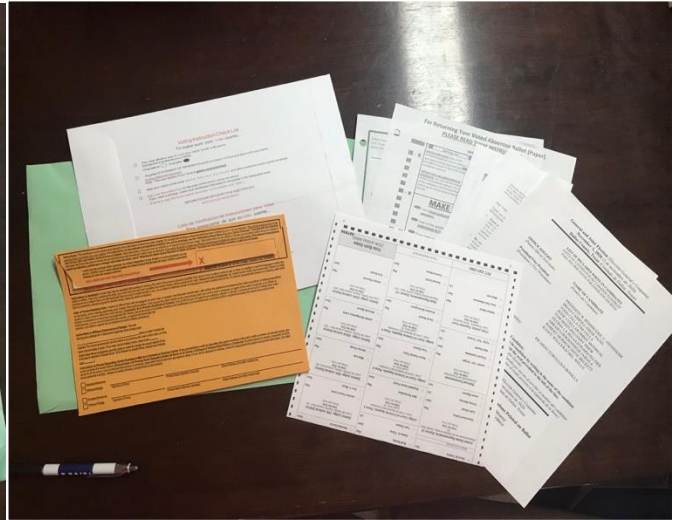
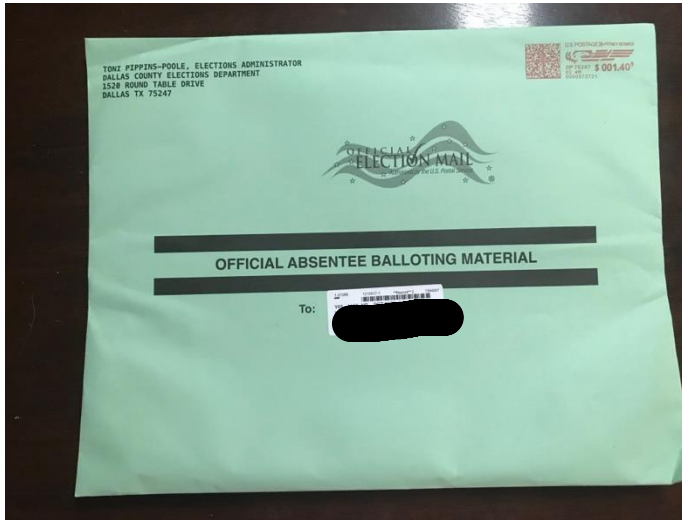
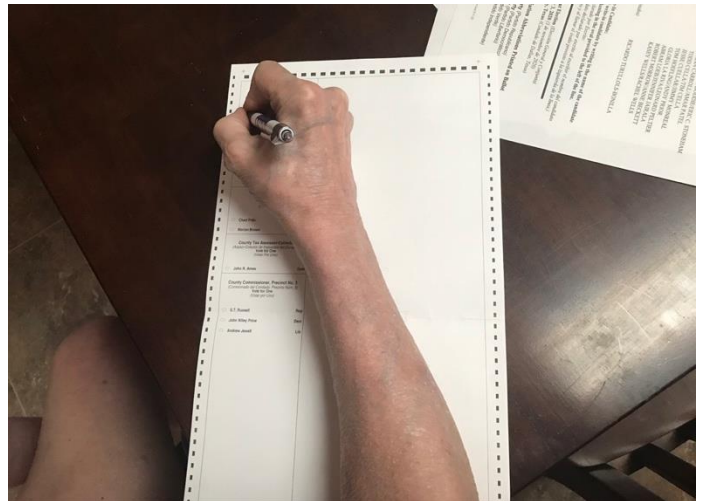
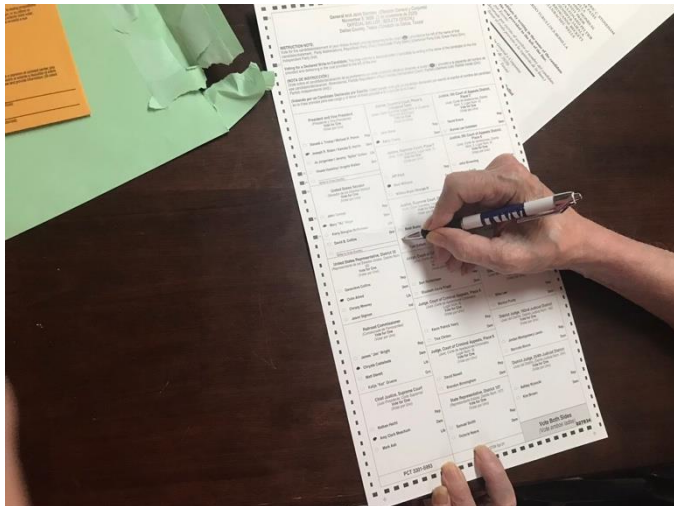


VOTING BY MAIL in Dallas County, Texas

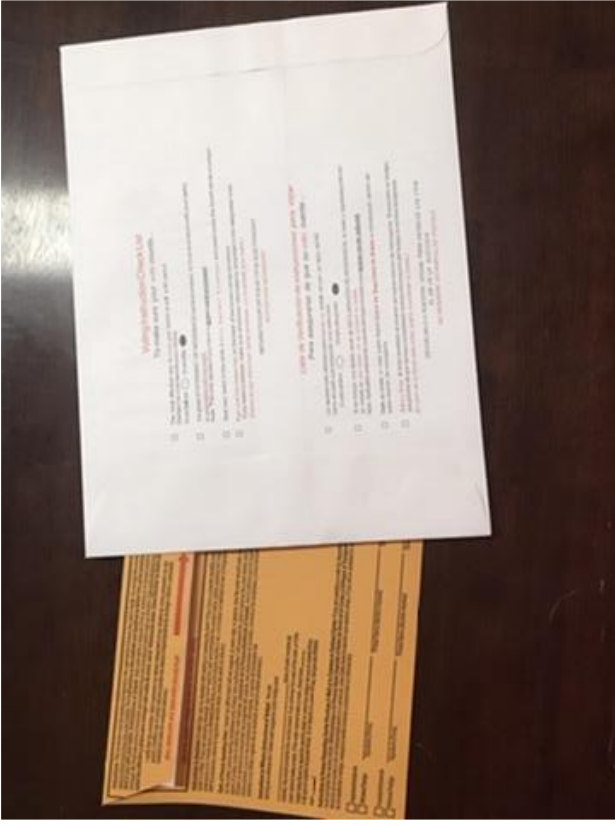
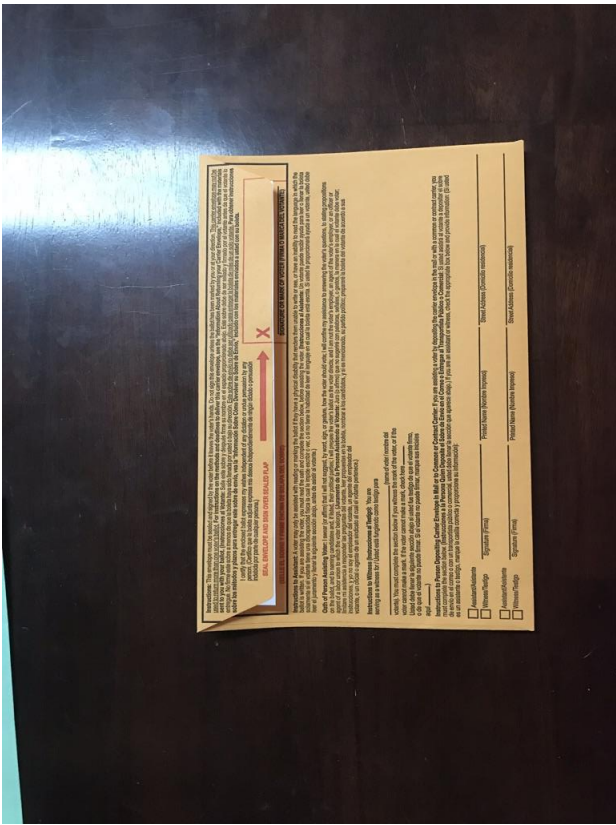
Michael filled out his ballot with a black pen, as instructed. Don't forget the back of the ballot!



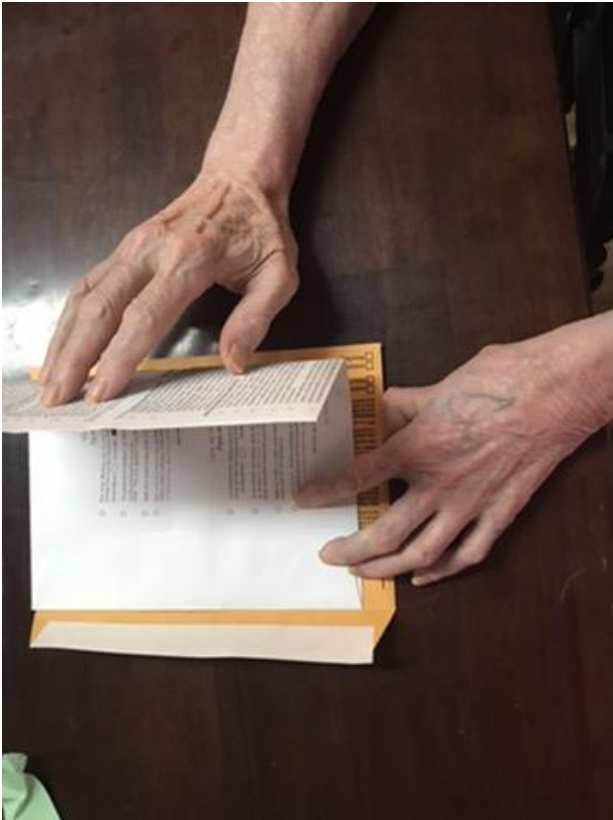
When he finished voting his choice in each contest, he put his ballot in the white “secrecy” envelope, as instructed, and sealed the envelope.



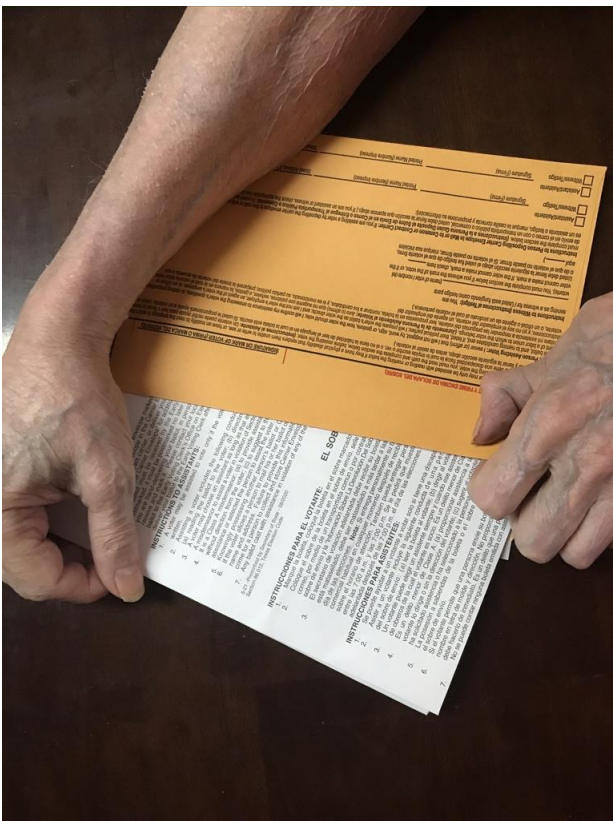
Next, the instructions say to put the white secrecy envelope into the brown mailer. But wait, the white envelope is too big! It won't fit!



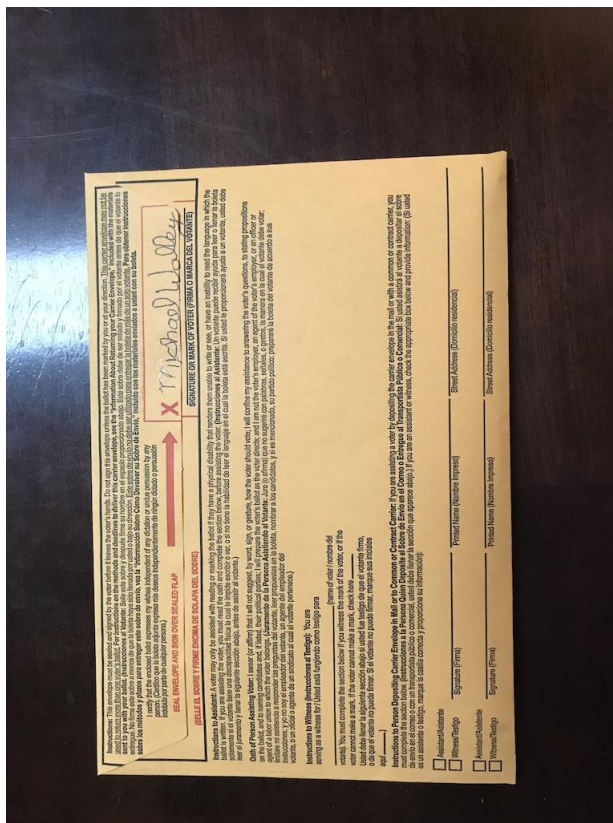
Not to worry! Michael folds the white envelope and then it fits perfectly.



Slip the folded white envelope inside the brown mailer and seal the mailer.



Very important! Sign your name on the back of the brown mailer. Sign at the **big red X** right over the sealed envelope's flap. Sign your usual signature like you did on your application for a mail ballot. The signature should match the name on the return address label on the front of the envelope.
